Finally, St. Matthew's is searching for a music director. I am hopeful that a candidate will emerge soon and we can begin the next chapter of our music ministry at St. Matthew's. In the meantime, I would like to thank Sandy Moore for her hard work over the summer providing hymns and songs for our worship, as well as John and Christie Hatch for offering their musical gifts on a Sunday or two. Looking ahead, I am also excited for the return of Robbie Breaux behind the organ and piano for the next couple of Sundays. Three cheers for our staff musicians and volunteers at St. Matthew's in this time of transition!

Sunday, August 20th: E.Y. E. (Episcopal Youth Event) Report.

Developed in response to the mandate of the Episcopal Church's 1982 General Convention and open to Episcopal youth from Grades 9-12, young people from throughout the Episcopal Church gathered in Baltimore from July 4th-8th for this exciting and faith-filled event. Come and hear what the young people from St. Matt's experienced in this gathering and how it felt to meet other youth from throughout the country who share in our faith and worship.

Sunday, August 27th: What Does It Mean to be a Deacon of the Church?

Among other things, at ordination a deacon vows to "make Christ and his redemptive work known, by word and example, to those among whom you live, and work, and worship. You are to interpret to the Church the needs, concerns, and hopes of the world." Join Deacon Rich this Sunday as he discusses the diaconal ministry and what it calls all of God's church to do.

Sunday, September 3th: Labor Day weekend; No meeting (just enjoy the fruit of your labor).

Sunday, September 10th: Do Episcopalians "Go to Confession?"

Pages 446 thru 452 of the Prayer Book contain a rite for "The Reconciliation of a Penitent." What does this mean for Episcopalians? What is the history and the thinking behind this practice? Do I have to go to confession? When might it be helpful... or maybe even necessary? This week Father Emil will lead a discussion of this much under-used but graced sacramental act.

As usual, all offerings will begin at 9:00 AM.

How do we live a mystically driven life? What does it feel like? Is it just another fringy fad or does mysticism have an abiding history that can mean being touched, held, and compelled by something deeper than your head and your feelings.

Ronald Rolheiser, a specialist in the field of spirituality. There will be ample time for discussion afterward.

This series will run from 6:30 to 8:00 PM on three successive Tuesdays, September 26th thru October 10th, in the church conference room. Believers and seekers—all are welcome.
